

## #TAKINGITBACKTO2020

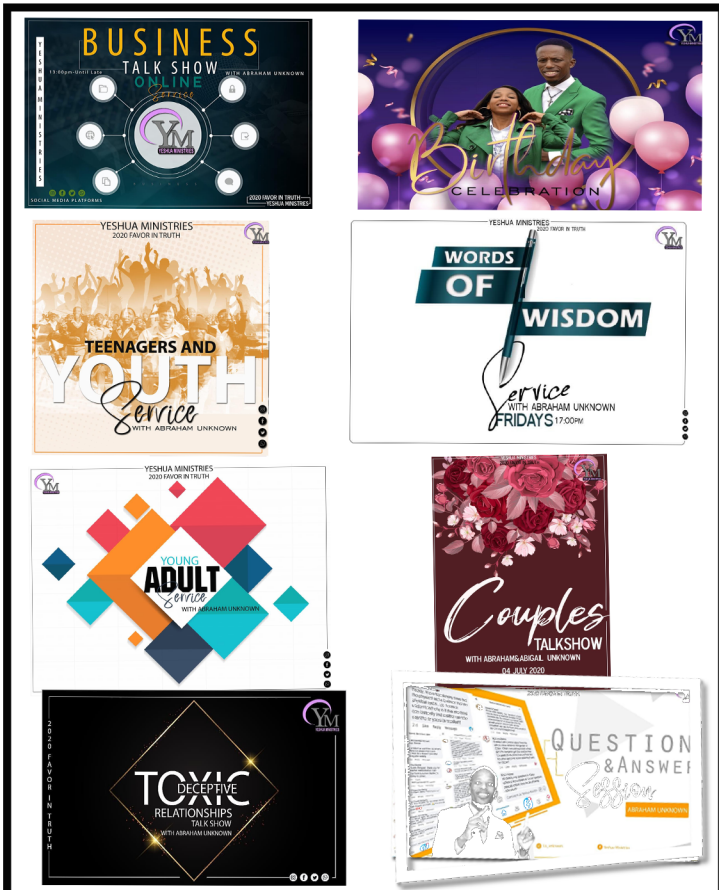
